What you can do to help your child at home:

- For writing skills, get your child a notebook and let them draw, write, etc.. (this helps practice holding a pencil).
- Let your child dress and feed themselves (Beginning steps of tying shoes)
- Practice coloring in the lines (not scribbling) and using a wide array of colors
- If your child can't do something on their own encourage them to try again before you help (this helps build self —esteem).
- Practice writing letters of the alphabet
- Practice writing first and last name (Capital first letter and the rest lower case)
- Reciting first and last name, address and phone number
- Holding a pencil properly (pencil grip)
- Using polite manners (please, thank you, you're welcome, may I, excuse me)
- Scissor skills (cutting on the line)



- Practice identifying shapes, numbers and numbers
- Cleans up after playing
- Can wash hands independently
- Can carry out simple chores with little direction (clear plate, throw trash away, clean up toys)
- Understanding appropriate dress for the weather (Zipping jackets)
- Counting by 1's
- Sight Words (Dolch Pre-primer List)

Where is your child's work?

Koalas-Your child will bring their work home in a daily folder.

Pandas-Your child will bring their work home weekly.

Please make sure to check their folder.

<u> Pehavior Management System</u>

Each day the class will start their day off on Green "Ready to Learn". They can move their clip up to Blue "Good Choices" or even higher to Purple "Great Choices". If they go above and beyond, then they can reach Pink. These are things like caught being polite and kind without prompting, or having an outstanding day. If a child is having a difficult time following directions, after redirection and reminders, the child will move their clip to Yellow-"Warning", Orange- "Consequences" or Red -"Parent Contact". The clips and colors are a visual reminder for the children. The children can get "back on track" and move their clip back up by making better choices and following directions. Please ask your child what color he/she was on and celebrate their great days and reinforce classroom expectations on days they struggled. Behavior will be relayed home through a behavior calendar in their Take Home Folder.

<u>One Last Thing –</u>

Transitioning to a new room - Often transition can cause stress for your child for the first couple of weeks. It is normal. Crying, not wanting to eat, or sleep at naptime are all normal behaviors and should diminish as your child becomes familiar with their routine and teachers. We ask that if this situation occurs with your child, reassuring your child that they will be just fine and a quick drop off in the mornings will help everyone and everything run more smoothly.
